### Tavern update

IWC Innovations has conducted a remediation and sanitization of the Cow Palace, and the Cow Palace has implemented a Water Management plan. They also have two people who have completed A Certified Pool &Spa Operator Certification and have conducted an immediate sample for testing, and are required to do other sampling every quarter, 6 months, and then yearly after, and are currently waiting for the test results and will monitor those and all others after. Also went out there doing a kitchen assessment inspection, the fire alarms went off, and most food was discarded, and all surfaces had to be cleaned and sanitised.
